



## **Bernard Wysocki, Jr.**

Mr. Wysocki recently established his own company, to conduct investment research for hedge funds. He recently retired from the Wall Street Journal, where he spent 32-years as a reporter, editor and bureau chief. In recent years he focused on special projects, including a long profile of University of Texas Medical Branch in 2003.

Bernie joined the Journal in 1975. He was a reporter in Cleveland and Chicago, bureau chief in Philadelphia and Tokyo (1985-1988) and held a number of editing positions at Journal headquarters in New York. He moved to Washington in 1995, and spent the latter half of the 1990s covering major economic issues, both in the United States and globally. In early 2002, he shifted his focus to health and science. In early 2006, he shifted to finance. He has won several journalism awards over the past twenty years, on topics such as U.S.-Japan business competition and the economics of the U.S. health care system.

His career has also included a stint on the business side of Dow Jones, the Journal's parent company. Between 1991 and 1995, he directed the launch of two Dow Jones electronic-news services in Europe, the Middle East and Asia.

A native of Waterloo, Iowa, and an honors graduate of Dartmouth College (A.B. 1971), Bernie lives in Potomac, Maryland, with his wife and two children.
